Gospel Summary

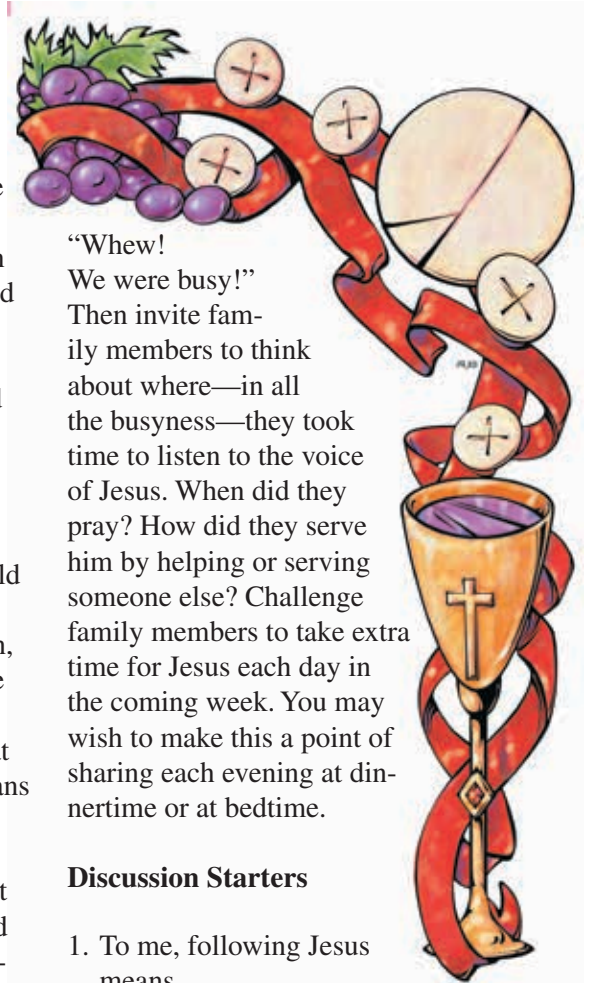
Jesus continues to call disciples to come and follow him. Simon and Andrew left their nets to follow him. James and John left their nets, their father, and their hired men to follow him. Jesus' presence and Jesus' words moved these men to leave everything behind, even though they did not fully understand that to which they were being called.

Reflection for Families

In Catholic parishes throughout the world we continue to see in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) children, youth, and adults who are answering the call to follow Jesus. They come to the Church curious about who Jesus is, what he teaches, and what following him means in their daily lives. We are a part of the community that encourages and guides them on their journey of conversion. But conversion, the turning of our minds and our hearts and our lives to God, is something we are all called to. Today is a good day to think about where we need to turn to or turn back to God. What do we hear him calling us to do? To change? To be?

Bringing the Gospel into Your Family

Lead a fun discussion about all the things each family member did today. Conclude by saying (in an exaggerated tone),



“Whew!
We were busy!”
Then invite family members to think about where—in all the busyness—they took time to listen to the voice of Jesus. When did they pray? How did they serve him by helping or serving someone else? Challenge family members to take extra time for Jesus each day in the coming week. You may wish to make this a point of sharing each evening at dinnertime or at bedtime.

Why do we need both the Archbishop's Annual Appeal and the *On the Way - ¡Ándale!* Capital Campaign?

The Church's mission is advanced in important ways through both the Archbishop's Annual Appeal and the *On the Way - ¡Ándale!* Capital Campaign. In general, the annual appeal supports the daily operations of critical ministries throughout the archdiocese whereas the campaign funds more strategic, comprehensive, and larger scale initiatives to continue to build and grow our parishes, vocations, lay educational/formation programs and Catholic schools well into the future.

How much will I be expected to give to the campaign?

You will be invited to consider prayerfully a specific sacrificial pledge to the campaign. How much you end up pledging is, of course, your own faith-guided decision. According to the U.S. Bishops' 1992 Pastoral Letter, *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*, all we have is a gift from God. We give out of gratitude for our blessings and are asked to return to God in proportion to the blessings we have received. In this way our gift takes on spiritual significance and contributes to our sanctification.

LOVE, MARRIAGE & FAMILY

The Gift of Children - Part 1

1. What does marriage have to do with children?

Children are at the very heart of marriage. The “supreme gift” of marriage, a child (*GS*, no. 50), comes precisely through the mutual, loving self-gift exchanged between husband and wife. It is only because of their sexual difference that spouses are able to cooperate with God in the awesome adventure of welcoming a child into the world. Marriage is not just about satisfying adult desires, but is a pro-child institution. The community of the family is built upon the communion of the spouses (see *LF*, no. 7).

2. Does the Church think that marriage is a mere “instrument” for having children?

Certainly not. The Church does teach that the “proper mission” of husband and wife is having children and raising them (*GS*, no. 50). But spouses should never “use” each other in order to have a child, and marriages not blessed with children are fruitful through the spouses’ mutual gift of self and their loving service to others. A child is neither a product nor a trophy, but a gift - a human person with great dignity and worth. Spouses are not the ultimate source of their children, but are called to receive them lovingly from God by exercising responsible parenthood (which can mean welcoming many children, as well as postponing pregnancy for serious reasons).

3. What’s the difference between a husband and wife who can’t have children, and two persons of the same sex, who also can’t have children?

Only a man and a woman, as husband and wife, can enter into the two-in-one-flesh communion of persons. Only a man and a woman are able to conceive a child through each other. That is to say, only a man and a woman can be joined so intimately that their bodies work together in the common task of procreation. Even when a husband and wife do not in fact conceive a child (due to infertility, age, and so on), their sexual acts are still the kind of acts by which children are naturally conceived. In contrast, two persons of the same sex may be perfectly healthy, but will never be able to enter a one-flesh communion and thus unite in such a way that a child is conceived.
