Read the Gospel: Luke 24:35-48

### **Gospel Summary**

Jesus again says to his disciples, "Peace be with you." This startles and terrifies them, but Jesus shows them his hands and his feet, and they know that he is indeed who he says he is. He opens their minds to understand the scriptures and tells them that they have been witnesses to all the things the prophets foretold.

### **Reflection for Parents**

Think back over the years since your children were born. As you have watched them change and grow, where have you witnessed the power of God in their lives? How have you come to know, through watching them, that God is who he says he is—Creator, love, forgiveness, compassion, and mercy? What works of God have you been a witness to?

### **Bringing the Gospel into Your Family**

Gather around your family prayer table. Place upon it a globe or a map of the world. Point out the countries that are served through your parish's missionary efforts or through the missionary efforts of the Church (see crs.org, the official Web site of Catholic Relief services, for information on the Church's worldwide outreach ministry). Explain that many people in such countries are witnesses to the power of God because of the support, prayers, and generosity of families just like your family. Think of ways your family can support the outreach efforts of your parish or of the worldwide Catholic Church. Pray together for missionaries throughout the world.

### **Discussion Starters**

In place of discussion starter questions, remain gathered around the globe or map of the world. Choose one country you have mentioned in your family discussion today. Work together to learn more about that country. What is its capital city? How many people live in that country? What is the major religion in that country? Try a food from that country. Draw a picture of that country's flag. Find out what the Catholic Church is doing to make a difference there. Make a commitment to pray for the people in that country who are in need and, if possible, donate to a missionary outreach that serves that country.



### God's Plan for Love and Sexuality - Part 3

### Marriage: A Unique Communion of Persons


Marriage is a unique communion of persons, and it is on the basis of this communion that the family is called to become a community of persons. (St. John Paul II, Letter to Families..., no. 10)

God is the author of marriage. God willed that man and woman would be joined in such a way as to help each other to grow in holiness and to protect and nurture new life in their sacred relationship. Marriage builds the family and the society. Pope Francis reminds us that at "the center [of the home] we see the father and mother, a couple with their personal story of love. They embody the primordial divine plan clearly spoken of by Christ himself: 'Have you not read that he who made them from the beginning made them male and female?' (Mt 19:4)" (*Amoris Laetitia*, no. 9).

### Husband and Wife, a Communion of Persons

It is God who calls husband and wife to be an image of his own love in the world. Marital love is therefore marked by faithfulness, permanence, and openness to life. The marital bond is brought into reality by the free consent of a man and a woman. When two baptized Christians exchange their marital consent, their bond is taken up into Christ's love for his Church. Christian marriage, rooted in Christ, is a sacrament and has a special firmness.

The "intimate partnership of life and the love" that God designed for marriage has its own unique characteristics (see *Gaudium et spes*, no. 48). First, husband and wife are called to form a permanent communion of persons. Second, spouses are called to be stewards of the gift of life. They are to welcome children generously to their marital union. "The fruitfulness of



the human couple is a living and effective 'image,' a visible sign of [God's] creative act" (*Amoris Laetitia*, no. 10). Indeed, the Church teaches that Christian spouses receive a "kind of consecration in the duties and dignity of their state" (*Gaudium et spes*, no. 48).

Scripture has much to say about marriage. Probably the most telling is in the second chapter of Genesis. Adam's happy cry upon seeing Eve that this one "at last, is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh" (Gn 2:23) is an ancient confirmation of the truth and goodness of God's design for married love: "That is why a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife, and the two of them become one body" (Gn 2:24).



### Saint John Vianney

Feast Day: August 4; Born: 1768; Died: 1859

A man with vision overcomes obstacles and performs deeds that seem impossible. John Vianney was a man with vision. He wanted to become a priest, but had to overcome his meager formal schooling, which inadequately prepared him for seminary studies.

His failure to comprehend Latin lectures forced him to discontinue. Still, his vision of being a priest urged him to seek private tutoring. After a lengthy battle with the books, John was ordained.

Situations calling for "impossible" deeds followed him everywhere. As pastor of the parish at Ars, John encountered people who were indifferent and quite comfortable with their style of living. His vision led him through severe fasts and short nights of sleep.

His work as a confessor is John Vianney's most remarkable accomplishment. In the winter months he was to spend 11 to 12 hours daily reconciling people with God. In the summer months this time was increased to 16 hours. Unless a man was dedicated to his vision of a priestly vocation, he could not have endured this giving of self day after day.

The miracles recorded by his biographers are of three classes:

- first, the obtaining of money for his charities and food for his
- secondly, supernatural knowledge of the past and future;
- thirdly, healing the sick, especially children.

The greatest miracle of all was his life. He practiced mortification from his early youth. and for forty years his food and sleep were insufficient, humanly speaking, to sustain life. As his fame spread, more hours were consumed in serving God's people. Even the few hours he would allow himself for sleep were disturbed frequently by the devil. And yet he labored incessantly, with unfailing humility, gentleness, patience, and cheerfulness, until he was more than seventy-three years old. Who, but a man with vision, could keep going with ever-increasing strength?

In 1929, Pope Pius XI named him the patron of parish priests worldwide.
