

# 20<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### GOSPEL MEDITATION: JOHN 6:51-58

In this Sunday's Gospel, the conflict escalates in the Bread of Life Discourse. Confusion is mounting in the crowd. "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Their minds were thinking literally, not mystically. Jesus doesn't seem to help, however, and only drives his point home with more emphasis. "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you." Jesus would later institute the Eucharist at the Last Supper. There he would definitively establish the sacramental reality in which bread and wine become substantially his own Body and Blood. We celebrate this sacrament in the Mass.

Perhaps we do not always understand what we receive. "My flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink." What is the essence of food and drink? Food nourishes our bodies, providing essential calories for our survival.



Water is used throughout the body to cushion joints, regulate body temperature, and protect sensitive tissues like the brain. When we receive the Eucharist, we receive the spiritual equivalent of these essential elements. Like water, the Eucharist strengthens the sanctifying grace moving through us. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." The Eucharist connects us intimately to Jesus and confirms our union with him. That is why we abstain from the Eucharist while in a state of mortal sin. It would be a contradiction and deep disrespect to these words of Jesus. To receive the Body and Blood of Jesus is not a right but a gift we receive with deep humility.

As we receive the Bread of Life, grace strengthens our love, separates us from sin—even wiping away venial sins—unifies us with the universal Church, and helps commit us to humble service. Together we are nourished for our mission in the world!

#### LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

"Show me what is physically different between a host that is consecrated and one that is not." These are words that can be heard on the lips of anyone struggling with faith. Perhaps, they are heard on yours. Physical tests will reveal no difference. The difference is seen through faith. In one sense, it is simple. Either we believe that the risen Christ is present—soul and divinity—or we do not. The fruits of faith are the proof. In the Eucharist, God enters into the very depths of who we are. However, it is our choice whether we ignore what He does or act fully upon it. The Eucharist can change us. When people see that we are different, they in turn will themselves believe.





Our inaugural program has been a big success and we are currently *halfway* through the list of families who signed up.



## **REGISTRATION BEGINS THIS WEEKEND!!**

Registration for RE classes grades 1-12 & youth sacramental preparation classes: \$35 per child after all weekend Masses August 19 - 31 or weekdays, 9 a.m. - 6 p.m.

All registration will take place in the RE building.

First-time families (specifically sacramental students) MUST bring a copy of the child's baptismal certificate.

Sessions available on a first-come, first-served basis until full:

- Sunday 8:30 9:45 a.m. (attending 10 a.m. Mass): grades 1-8 ONLY
- Sunday 10:30 11:45 a.m. (attending 12 p.m. Mass): grades 1-8 ONLY
- Sunday 4:30 5:45 p.m.: high school Confirmation ONLY
- Wednesday 5:15 6:15 p.m.: grades 1-8 only
- Wednesday 6:45 7:45 p.m.: grades 1-8 & high school Confirmation classes



#### PARENTS: PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING VERY IMPORTANT SACRAMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

#### **Confirmation Requirements**

Preparation is a three-year process, beginning in 9<sup>th</sup> grade.

#### PARENT REQUIREMENTS:

- Attend Mass EVERY Saturday or Sunday and all Holy Days of Obligation.
- Participate in ALL orientations and parent conferences.
- Parents of third-year Confirmation students must attend the Sacramental Parent Class in the second week of each month during the same session that their child attends.

#### STUDENT REQUIREMENTS:

- Must attend Mass EVERY Saturday or Sunday and all Holy Days of Obligation. Students will be required to keep a Mass journal all three years.
- Must attend religious education class regularly. Only three unexcused absences are allowed. Failure to attend may result in repeat of the grade or delay in receiving the sacrament.
- Must attend ALL retreats. Missing these or failing to attend Mass may result in a delay of reception of the sacrament.
- Community service hours are required all three years.
- First-year students will be required to obtain a sponsor who is in good standing with the Church and will mentor them through this process.
- Second-year students will be asked to research saints in order to choose a patron saint for their guidance. They will be required to turn in a report and present it in class.

#### First Holy Communion & **Reconciliation Requirements**

Preparation for Reconciliation /First Holy Communion is a twoyear process. Formal instruction usually begins in 1st grade and concludes in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade. Both sacraments take place the second year.

#### PARENT REQUIREMENTS:

- Attend Mass EVERY Saturday or Sunday and all Holy Days of Obligation.
- Encourage an active family prayer life.
- Participate in ALL mandatory conferences: two parent conferences the second year.
- Ensure your child is mastering required prayers (outlined by grade online).
- Parents of the second-year students must attend the Sacramental Parent Class in the second week of each month during the same session that their child attends.

#### STUDENT REQUIREMENTS:

- Must attend Mass **EVERY** Saturday or Sunday and all Holy Days of Obligation.
- Must attend religious education class regularly. Only three unexcused absences are allowed. Failure to attend may result in repeat of the grade or delay in receiving the Sacraments.
- Must attend ALL three Reconciliation retreats.


