#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION: LK 21:25-28, 34-36**

Tribulation. Wildfires. Tsunamis. Moral corruption. Disease. War. We tend to associate

these things with the end times, and perhaps for good reason! In today's Gospel, Jesus says: "People will die of fright in anticipation of what is coming upon the world." Not exactly putting us in the Christmas spirit, is it? During Advent, we anticipate a celebration of Christ's first coming. There is a quiet stillness about our waiting, or at least we try to encourage that in ourselves. Perhaps we have an Advent devotional or we take time to pray together as a family around the Advent wreath.

But Jesus did not come only once into history. During Advent, we remember that he will come again. You may remember the rapture craze in the early 2000s, when a series of books and movies envisioned a future where Jesus was coming soon and all the true believers had been whisked away. Everyone else had one more chance to repent before things really went to hell...literally, in this case!

But is that what Jesus is talking about



here? The truth is, we don't know what Jesus' Second Coming will be like. The actual return of Christ - though sudden and perhaps frightening to some - should not frighten us. Despite all the stories we may have heard about the apocalypse, the advice of Jesus is not to hang our heads or cower in fear. "Stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand." In a certain sense, we are already living in the end times. We already encounter great tribulation. We all find it easy to get distracted or discouraged in the grind of daily life. Today's Gos-

pel reminds us that vigilance for God's presence is needed now.

#### LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

As we begin our Advent journey in preparation for the celebration of Christ's birth and in anticipation of his coming again in glory, we are reminded of our need to be vigilant and prepared. This short season of Advent can be a mini-retreat for us who find ourselves living in a world that is often counterproductive to developing mature, focused, and meaningful relationships with God. Being a Christian and standing firm in our faith requires a strength that can only come from prayer. These four short preparatory weeks can help us look back to what God has done in history, to what God continues to do in our lives today, and to what God promises for the future. May we use this Advent time wisely, calling us to greater holiness.





# OPEN WIDE OUR HEARTS: THE ENDURING CALL TO LOVE — A Pastoral Letter Against Racism



#### The Call to Address Racism in Our Hearts and Communities

"But racism still profoundly affects our culture, and it has no place in the Christian heart. This evil causes great harm to its victims, and it corrupts the souls of those who harbor racist or prejudicial thoughts. The persistence of the evil of racism is why we are writing this letter now."

-Open Wide our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love, Nov. 15, 2018

In their new pastoral letter against racism, *Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love*, the Catholic bishops of the United States invite conversion of hearts, minds, and institutions in order to address the evil of racism that still exists in our communities.

By our baptism, we are members of Christ's body and sharers in his mission. Imitating Christ, we must care for all members of our communities, honoring each person as unique, sacred, and created in the image of God. We know that the evil of racism cuts to the core of God's plan for humanity, devaluing the diversity God created within the human family. As followers of Christ, we seek to reclaim the God-given sanctity of each person's inviolable human dignity. The bishops remind us, "The command of love requires us to make room for others in our hearts. It means that we are indeed our brother's keeper (see Gn 4:9)."

Some among us may want to believe that our country has moved beyond the reality of racism that has so profoundly stained its past, or that racism does not involve us. Almost every day, news headlines demonstrate that our country's "original sin" of racism continues to impact the lives of many Americans, many of them Catholic—particularly those who belong to the African American, Hispanic/Latino, or Native American communities.

There are signs that racism's legacies remain prevalent in many systemic inequalities that have deep impact on people of color. The bishops write, "Racism can only end if we contend with the policies and institutional barriers that perpetuate and preserve the inequality—economic and social—that we still see all around us."

Within the walls of the Church, many people of color have experienced discrimination and outright racism. Leadership has been lacking. The bishops write, "All too often, leaders of the Church have remained silent about the horrific violence and other racial injustices perpetuated against African Americans and others." Reflecting on these realities, the bishops implore us to find ways to actively work against the evil of racism. We must seek racial justice within our Church and in our country. Let us all allow the Holy Spirit to convert our hearts to do the work of healing, so we may live authentically in true relationship to one another. Let the fruit of this conversion be evident in our full celebration and integration of ethnic and cultural diversity, which is truly a gift from God.



# 4th Annual St. Anthony Claret Christmas Posadas Saturday, Dec. 15 — Sunday Dec. 24

The Posadas are a tradition brought to Mexico from Spain in the 1500s by Catholic missionaries and commemorate Mary and Joseph's difficult journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem in search of a place for the Christ child to be born.

In Spanish, the word *posada* means dwelling or lodging. During the procession parishioners sing along—one group asking for shelter and another group inside the dwelling denying ituntil the first group arrives to the shelter that joyfully and humbly receives them.

They are a means to prepare our hearts with joy and prayer for the arrival of Jesus Christ and to remember and relive the moments that Joseph and Mary experienced before the birth of Jesus. They are held on nine consecutive evenings. These represent Mary's nine months of pregnancy.



La tradición de las Posadas fue traída a México de España en 1500s por misioneros católicos y es una conmemoración de María y de José y su difícil viaje de Nazaret a Belén en busca de un lugar para el nacimiento del niño Jesús.

La palabra posada significa vivienda o alojamiento. Durante la precesión, la gente canta junto al primer grupo de peregrinos pidiendo un lugar donde llegar, y el otro grupo de peregrinos están adentro negando la entrada. Hasta que al final, el primer grupo de peregrinos encuentra un lugar donde llegar y felizmente y humildemente los reciben.

Son un medio para preparar con alegría y oración nuestro corazón para la llegada de Jesucristo, y para recordar y vivir los momentos que pasaron José y María antes del nacimiento de Jesús. Las posadas continúan durante nueve días consecutivos. Estos días representan nueve meses del embarazo de María.




