#### Parish Mission Statement



#### GOSPEL MEDITATION: LK 10:25-37

Loving isn't too difficult, right? Many of us are surrounded by kind, lovely people trying to do the right thing. Indeed, to "love your neighbor as yourself" seems like it should be easy enough. Treat people like you would like to be treated. Bring the new neighbors some baked goods (normal and gluten-free, just in case). Chat with the bank teller about his holiday weekend. Write an occasional card to your sister "just because." There were probably varieties of these acts of kindness in Jesus' day. Perhaps substituting figs for cookies. But "exchange pleasantries with the traveling cloth merchant" isn't the example Jesus gives.

"A man fell victim to robbers...they stripped him and beat him and went off leaving him half-dead." The righteous pass by the scene of the dying man. The hero of the story is the one on the margins of Jewish society, who perhaps would not have been welcomed, in other circumstances, by the man now in the



ditch. His neighborly love causes him to halt his journey, to tend wounds, and to pay for the man's care out of his own savings. Are we interruptible? Are we attentive to the hurts of



We can't help everyone, but God does place opportunities in our path for compassion and courageous love. This week, be "the one who treated him with mercy."

#### LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

We have heard the story of the Good Samaritan so many times. Have we ever realized that it is an enemy and outcast who is the hero of the story? Freed from laws that limit acts of mercy and compassion, the Samaritan becomes the example of how to love God by loving our neighbor. Our minds know what our faith teaches, and our mouths know what words to speak. Ultimately, deep down in our conscience, we know how we ought to act. #### **LOVE & MARRIAGE**



#### Male and Female He Created Them

On June 10, 2019, the Vatican Congregation for Catholic Education released a reflection on human sexuality entitled: "'Male and Female He Created Them': Towards a Path of Dialogue on the Question of Gender Theory in Education." (You can read the document in its entirety here: http://www.educatio.va/content/dam/cec/Documenti/19\_0997\_INGLESE.pdf.)

The document is the fullest exposition of the concept of gender (gender identity, gender fluidity, 'transgenderism,' etc.) that has been released from the Vatican to date. It is concerned with the "educational crisis... in the field of affectivity and sexuality" (no. 1) and reiterates Catholic anthropology, rooted in Sacred Scripture and Tradition. "The Christian vision of anthropology sees sexuality as a fundamental component of one's personhood" (no. 4).

The document seeks to combat the dualism that is operative in the idea that "one's gender ends up being viewed as more important than being of male or female sex. The effect of this move is chiefly to create a cultural and ideological revolution driven by relativism, and secondarily a juridical revolution, since such beliefs claim specific rights for the individual and across society" (no. 20). This is precisely what legislation such as the Equality Act does. #### **Catholic Weddings: The Questions Before Consent**

"The Questions before the Consent" are an important part of a Catholic wedding ceremony. True to its name, this moment entails the celebrant (priest or deacon) asking the bride and groom a series of questions immediately before they exchange their consent and are married. As the *Order of Celebrating Matrimony* explains, these questions involve the couple's "freedom of choice, fidelity to each other, and the acceptance and upbringing of children" (no. 60). While they are asked the questions together, each person must answer the questions individually. It is a solemn moment, as bride and groom pledge before God and the community their intention to undertake through God's grace the vocation of lifelong marriage, a permanent union open to the gift of new life. Celebrant:



[Name] and [Name], have you come here to enter into Marriage without coercion, freely and wholeheartedly? The bridegroom and bride each say: I have.

The celebrant continues: Are you prepared, as you follow the path of Marriage, to love and honor each other for as long as you both shall live?

The bridegroom and bride each say: I am.

The following question may be omitted, if circumstances suggest this, for example, if the couple are advanced in years.


Celebrant: Are you prepared to accept children lovingly from God and to bring them up

according to the law of Christ and his Church?

The bridegroom and bride each say: I am.
