# GOSPEL MEDITATION: MT 2:13-15, 19-23

"Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you." 725 kilometers. That's the distance on modern roads from Bethlehem to Cairo. Assuming one covered 40km a day on foot — ambitious for two young parents and their infant son — the journey would take well over two weeks. Of course, the Holy Family didn't have modern roads. They would travel through wilderness, fear bandits, run low on water, and cross the vast Sinai Peninsula in a reverse of their forefathers in Exodus. Here, in struggle and sacrifice, are the beginnings of the forging of the Holy Family.

"Joseph rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed for Egypt. He stayed there until the death of Herod." Large Jewish communities existed in most major cities of the ancient Mediterranean world, after the collapse of their kingdoms

chronicled in the Old Testament, and Joseph could likely find work as a carpenter. All the same, today's Gospel reminds us that the first formational years of Jesus as a babe-in-arms were spent in a strange land. The members of the Holy Family were foreigners, outsiders,



immigrants.

The Word became flesh and dwelt among us. God took on our humanity. He is in solidarity with our own trials and difficulties. On the feast of the Holy Family, we honor the special place of the family within society. We are invited, too, to recall those families who share in the struggles of the Holy Family in a particular way. We pray for immigrants, asylum seekers, and refugees. We pray for all parents who sacrifice their own well-being and comfort so their children may have a better life.

#### LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Families can be challenging. As much as they can be places of love, growth, and life, they can also be places of hurt, conflict, and despair. What has been your experience of family? There is no way around it: being human requires family life. We have to learn how to celebrate and embrace as well as forgive and understand. Virtue is required. St. Paul asks us to "put on heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience." We are asked to bear with one another and forgive one another. These are tall orders for anyone, but they are not impossible achievements. If we keep our eyes on Jesus and trust in God as the Holy Family did, St. Paul's vision is obtainable. Our families can take on a sacramental character and become places where God's love is revealed. ©LPi

# Feast of the Holy Family

POPE FRANCIS' VISION IS A VISION OF JOY-FILLED LOVE.

LET'S SHARE IT!

In Amoris Laetitia, Pope Francis calls dialogue "essential" for family life.

- Recognize the real "importance" and dignity
  of the other person. Recognize others' right
  "to think as they do and to be happy." Pope
  Francis challenges us to acknowledge the
  values of the other's "deepest concerns" and
  what he or she is try to say (no. 138).
- Try to understand where the other person is coming from: his or her pain, disappointments, fear, anger, hopes, and dreams (no. 137).
- Put yourself in the other's "shoes"; try to "peer" into his or her heart. This is the starting point for dialogue (no. 138).
- 4. Be ready to "listen patiently and attentively to everything the other person wants to say." Dialogue requires the "self-discipline" of waiting until someone is finished speaking before responding. And, it means truly listening to what someone else is saying—not planning a comeback before the other person has even finished speaking (no. 137).
- "Keep an open mind." We need not stick to our own "limited ideas and opinions," but we must "be prepared to change or expand them." Our goal is "synthesis" that enriches everyone involved in the dialogue. We don't seek unity in diversity, Pope Francis says, but rather "reconciled diversity" (no. 139).
- Our goal is to advance the common good. Respect and appreciation for the "other" are necessary prerequisites (no. 139).
- Try not to offend, and don't vent. We must choose our words carefully, be sensitive to how

others feel, and never seek to inflict hurt. We must also avoid a "patronizing" tone, which "only serves to hurt, ridicule, accuse and offend others" (no. 139).

- Love everyone. "Love," Pope Francis writes, "surmounts even the worst barriers." When we come from a place of love, we can better understand others (no. 140).
- Base positions on beliefs and values, not on the desire to "win" an argument or be "proved right" (no. 140).
- 10. Pray! True dialogue, Pope Francis reminds us, "can only be the fruit of an interior richness" nourished by our quiet time with God through reading, reflection, prayer, and "openness to the world around us" (no. 141).
- 11. These are challenging words from Pope Francis. How might our own families be different if we took his words to heart?






