
Together we strive to grow closer to Jesus Christ through the Holy Eucharist.

#### GOSPEL MEDITATION: JN 9:1-41

"Do you believe in the Son of Man?" Jesus wants to motivate each one of us to see the truth. After developing a relationship with Jesus, the blind man "sees" as someone very special. The Pharisees, due to the blindness caused by their ignorance, prejudice, and need for self-preservation, still remain blind. Presuppositions, prejudices, assumptions, and our needs can easily blind us to truth. We see what we want or need to see and not what is really there. In addition, our stubbornness continues to convince us that we are right and that our vision is perfect. Only God can complete the picture.

Look around at our world. So much of what is happening today is due to the reluctance of folks to allow themselves to be stretched and brought to see what is really there. Many react to what life presents to them more with the lenses of ignorance than lenses of clarity. The Gospel carries great trans-



#### LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

"Seeing is much more than just a function of our eyes. We can look at something with clear vision but not really see it. Often what we think we see is colored by our presuppositions, prejudices, assumptions, and needs. We judge things by appearance, but God looks into the heart. God's sight has a much wider range and far greater depth. Receiving things or people just based on appearance can lead us to erroneous and hurtful judgments. We think we are seeing clearly, but we are not. Allowing God to restore our sight so that we can truly see is a worthy goal for our Lenten journey. Look within and look without. What do you see? Allow God to complete the picture for you. Ask Him to give you the insight to look into someone's heart. Don't draw hasty conclusions or presume you know the truth. Be open and humble enough so that you can receive the sight that only God can give.

Archbishop Gustavo issues degree regarding changes impacting Catholic parishes and schools in the archdiocese in response to COVID-19

PUBLISHED: MARCH 13, 2020

Archbishop Gustavo García-Siller, MSpS, issued the following decree, March 13, 2020, to the people of the Archdiocese of San Antonio about required changes in response to COVID-19.

I am with you on our Lenten journey. At this time we are confronted once more with the fragility of our lives, and again we are reminded of our common humanity; that we are all one family under God. We want to face this crisis together. It is so important to be anchoring in our faith; to have God at the center of our daily lives.

In regards to COVID-19, the Archdiocese of San Antonio is trying to be pro-active rather than reactive to this rapidly changing situation, which especially impacts the most vulnerable.

In appropriate response to the current crisis, local, state and federal officials have been taking additional actions regarding this public health emergency. This morning, officials with the city of San Antonio and Bexar County announced that they were banning gatherings of more than 500 people, and strongly suggested that this measure extends to groups of 250 or more. In addition, this afternoon the Texas governor declared a state disaster declaration over the coronavirus. I am also enacting several measures impacting Catholic parishes and schools in the archdiocese.

While COVID-19 is unlikely to be serious for most people, we have an obligation to care for the very young, the aged, and those with underlying health issues. An effective way we can care for their health and safety is minimizing large group gatherings for the time being.

We are not taking these actions lightly, but with the realization that large gatherings are a factor in the spread of the disease; that there is a long lead time before symptoms present themselves and infection is known; that priests, deacons, and lay ministers could unknowingly transmit the disease to others, or congregants to one another; and that the saving work of Jesus Christ present in the Church is necessary at a time such as this.

Conscious of my duty to prudently lead the Christian faithful of the Archdiocese of San Antonio, and in light of new information from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and local and state health officials regarding COVID-19 (coronavirus), and for the good of the Christian faithful and our community, I Decree that:

1) The Sunday Mass obligation is hereby dispensed for all Catholics effective immediately. Public Masses in parishes and other chapels shall be suspended starting this weekend of March 14-15, except for small groups at the discretion of the pastor, such as daily Mass. Presiding at wedding liturgies and quinceañeras is at the discretion of the pastor. We must bury the dead, and Cont'd on page 4

funeral services will still take place, with awareness of congregation size. Whenever possible churches will be kept open during the daytime for private prayer and Eucharistic Adoration.

- 2) All non-essential gatherings at parishes for the rest of March are cancelled or postponed, pending further notice. This includes but is not limited to previously-scheduled Confirmation ceremonies, and religious education classes. Communication on Catholic schools will follow.
- 3) We are advising against home visits at this time, but in situations of serious pastoral necessity these decisions need to be made on a case-by-case basis at the discretion of the pastor, responding to the best of their abilities to these requests. We must also follow hospital and nursing home guidelines regarding access as well.
- 4) I encourage viewing and participating in the daily and Sunday Masses via CTSA, other television outlets or through archdiocesan electronic media. Other devotions, such as perhaps praying the daily rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet, are most appropriate during this time.
- 5) I will make a determination in consultation with archdiocesan leadership, health officials, and civil authorities regarding extending any of the above by March 31.

This Decree is effective immediately and remains in effect until revoked.
