
Together we strive to grow closer to Jesus Christ through the Holy Eucharist.



#### **LOVE & MARRIAGE**

### 7 Signs of a Functional Relationship— Part 1

(from Catholic Match Institute)

During my year studying Interpersonal Communications, I was introduced to the work of one of the top researchers in marriage and relationship health, Dr. John M. Gottman. Throughout my post college years, I have kept up with his research. He is most famous for developing a formula that accurately predicts divorce after observing a couple interact with one another for only five minutes!



Here I will describe Dr. John Gottman's findings through his research on successful, happy couples, as written in his book, *The Science of Trust*.

#### 1. Matches in Conflict Style

Most people fall into one of three conflict styles: validators, avoiders, and volatiles. If the ratio of positivity to negativity in conflicts was 5:1, the relationships were functional. However, mismatches in conflict style will increase risk of divorce. The mismatches usually mean one person wants the other to change, but that person is avoiding change. The researchers did not find any volatiles and avoiders matched. They speculate it's because they don't get past the courtship phase!

#### 2. Dialogue With Perpetual Issues

Gottman discovered that only 31% of couples' disagreements were resolvable! This means the majority of conflicts were about perpetual problems, which was attributed to personality differences (even among similar temperaments). While active listening seems like a good idea in theory, it almost never is practiced or works in real life settings, because if there is any negativity at all, the listener finds that hard to ignore and will usually react to it

One of the biggest indicators for a successful relationship is having a "soft" start-up. This usually puts the pressure on women, since we are the ones who bring up issues in the relationship 80% of the time. The positive responses in these conflicts were from couples in relationships who used the gentler start-up. So remember to keep your sense of humor, and be sensitive to your beloved! Dialogue is necessary to avoid "gridlock" in conflicts, and remember, God created us uniquely, so rejoice in that!

#### 3. Present Issues as Situational Joint Problems

Instead of blaming your spouse for your feelings of irritability and disappointment in the relationship, express how you feel, but then identify your needs. Be gentle in this conversation. Focus on what he or she is doing right, and acknowledge that first. Remember, you're not perfect either, so don't expect gratitude for your complaints.

#### THE ENDURING CALL TO LOVE

#### Prophetic Witnesses Against Racism—Part 2

At times in its history, the Catholic Church in the United States has failed to denounce the evils of slavery, racism, and discrimination. But we have also been blessed with the courageous witness of many clerics, religious women and men and laypersons, who did respond prophetically by calling out sin and violent disregard for fellow human beings. Their lives remind everyone that we are all united in God's love and the life of Christ. Read about these four Catholics who worked to heal the evil of racism in their day. As you learn about their stories, reflect on how you can join this work of healing injustice in your community today.

#### Venerable Rev. August Tolton

Fr. Augustus Tolton is known as the first recognizably black Catholic priest in the U.S., (though the Healy brothers—three sons of an enslaved black woman and an Irish father, whose African heritage was less visibly apparent—had become priests before him). Fr. Tolton was born into slavery to Catholic parents whose owners allowed their slaves to be married in the Catholic Church. As a result, he was born and raised Catholic. Fr. Tolton became free when his mother escaped to the free state of Illinois when he was a boy. He was encouraged by his local priest to enter the priesthood, but had to study in Italy, since no American seminary would admit him due to his skin color. He was ordained in Rome on Easter Sunday at the Catholic damit him due to his skin color. He was ordained in Rome on Easter Sunday at the Catholic community in Quincy, Illinois. Fr. Tolton led the develop-



ment and construction of St. Monica's Catholic Church as a black 'National Parish Church," completed in 1893. Tolton's success at ministering to black Catholics quickly earned him national attention within the Catholic hierarchy. "Good Father Gus," as he was called by many, was known for his eloquent sermons, his beautiful singing voice and his talent for playing the accordion. He was also known for generosity and piety, attracting both black and white Catholics to his parish. He inspired many of the affluent parishioners to support the parish's school and its mission to educate the community. Later chased out of Quincy, he was welcomed by the Archdiocese of Chicago, where he dedicated his ministry to serving impoverished communities. He died in 1897. Despite his experiences, Fr. Tolton remained steadfast: "The Catholic Church deplores a double slavery – that of the mind and that of the body. She endeavors to free us of both." He is the subject of the biography *From Slave to Priest: The Inspirational Story of Father Augustine Tolton (1854-1897)* by Sister Caroline Hemesath.

#### **Mass Participation**

- Masks will be required for all persons, except children 10 years old and younger.
- No missalettes, song books, or prayer aids will be available.
- There will be no singing; only instrumental music during the Mass.
- There will be no exchange of peace by handshake or hug.

#### Mass Attendance and Seating

- Attendance will be limited to **50%** of our normal capacity.
- Weekend Masses: Saturday 5 p.m.; Sunday 8 & 10 a.m., 12 p.m., 3 p.m. (Spanish) & 6 p.m.
- Mass will be held in the main sanctuary with overflow livestreamed in Msgr. Hubertus Hall.
   Sacramental Communion offered in both locations.
- Hospitality team members will seat you and you will need to sit at least six (6) feet apart. Family members may sit together without separation.
- Hospitality team members will also escort you from the church immediately after each Mass to allow time to sanitize the church prior to the next Mass.
- Follow the directions of our hospitality team members.
- Daily Mass will follow same guidelines for attendance, masks and social distancing.

#### Communion

- Remove gloves BEFORE receiving Holy Communion.
- The Sacred Body of Christ will be distributed in the hand only, not on the tongue.
- Before reception of Holy Communion, lower your mask, allow the Eucharistic minister to place the Body of Christ in your hand, consume it, re-mask, and return to your seat.
- The Precious Blood of Christ will not be distributed.

#### Other Information and Guidelines

- The church will not open more than 20 minutes before Mass.
- All Masses will continue to be streamed online.
- A hospitality team member will bring the offertory basket to you. Drop your donation in.
- Only the main doors of the church will be open. Hospitality team members will escort you from there into church and from the sanctuary to the exit.
