
Together we strive to grow closer to Jesus Christ through the Holy Eucharist.

The community of believers receives the power and the presence to touch and heal in the name of the One they have welcomed



Christ and work to create a world of sufficiency, where the greed of

some no longer creates the want of others but where all of God's children can find a home and a place at the table of life. The One who makes a home within calls us to live a life that transforms. We are changed ourselves and now become agents of change for others. We are the Body of Christ. God is with us. We have been nourished.

Sadly, many are afraid to try. We know what we are called to do, but we struggle with feelings of doubt as to whether God really is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Do our systems have to change? Is it possible that we somehow missed the mark when we put all of our social networks in place and established the business of our lives? Perhaps we have to radically rethink our approach and that can scare us. We might have to give something up or change, and we don't want to. As long as want, injustice, division, prejudice, and scarcity still exit, there is tremendous work for the Body of Christ.

Wednesday, June 17

In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson marked the anniversary of that decree by officially establishing June 14 as Flag Day. He said, "This flag, which we honor and under which we serve, is the emblem of our unity, our power, our thought and purpose of a nation."

JUNE 19: FEAST OF THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Devotion to the Sacred Heart, as we know it, began about the year 1672. On repeated occasions, Jesus appeared to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun, in France, and during these apparitions He explained to her the devotion to His

Sacred Heart as He wanted people to practice it. he asked to be honored in the symbol of His Heart of flesh; he asked for acts of reparation, for frequent Communion, Communion on the First Friday of the month, and the keeping of the Holy Hour.

When the Catholic Church approved the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, she did not base her action only on the visions of Saint Margaret Mary. The Church approved the devotion on its own merits. There is only one Person in Jesus, and that Person was at the same time God and Man. His Heart, too, is Divine—it is the Heart of God.


There are two things that must always be found together in the devotion to the Sacred Heart: Christ's Heart of flesh and Christ's love for us. True devotion to the Sacred Heart means devotion to the Divine Heart of Christ insofar as His Heart represents and recalls His love for us.

In honoring the Heart of Christ, our homage lingers on the Person of Jesus in the fullness of His love. This love of Christ for us was the moving force of all he did and suffered for us—in Nazareth, on the Cross, in giving Himself in the Blessed Sacrament, in His teaching and healing, in His praying and working. When we speak of the Sacred Heart, we mean Jesus showing us His Heart, Jesus all love for us and all lovable.

Jesus Christ is the incarnation of God's infinite love. The Human Nature which the Son of God took upon Himself was filled with love and kindness that has never found an equal. He is the perfect model of love of God and neighbor.


Every day of His life was filled with repeated proofs of 'Christ's love that surpasses all knowledge' (Eph 3:19). Jesus handed down for all time the funda-

mental feature of His character: 'Take My yoke upon your shoulders and learn from Me, for I am meek and humble of Heart' (Mt 11:29). He invited all, refusing none, surprising friends and rivals by His unconditional generosity.



The love that Jesus bore toward us also urged Him to undergo the death of the Cross. At the Last Supper, He said, "There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends" (Jn 15:13)

The Heart of Jesus never ceases to love us in heaven. He sanctifies us through the Sacraments. These are inexhaustible fountains of grace and holiness which have their source in the boundless ocean of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.



Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, to Thee I consecrate and offer up my person and my life, my actions, trials, and sufferings, that my entire being may henceforth only be employed in loving, honoring and glorifying Thee. This is my irrevocable will, to belong entirely to Thee, and to do all for Thy love, renouncing with my whole heart all that can displease Thee.

I take Thee, O Sacred Heart, for the sole object of my love, the protection of my life, the pledge of my salvation, the remedy of my frailty and inconstancy, the reparation for all the defects of my life, and my secure refuge at the hour of my death. Be Thou, O Most Merciful Heart, my justification before God Thy Father, and screen me from His anger which I have so justly merited. I fear all from my own weakness and malice, but placing my entire confidence in Thee, O Heart of Love, I hope all from Thine infinite Goodness. Annihilate in me all that can displease or resist Thee. Imprint Thy pure love so deeply in my heart that I may never forget Thee or be separated from Thee.

I beseech Thee, through Thine infinite Goodness, grant that my name be engraved upon Thy Heart, for in this I place all my happiness and all my glory, to live and to die as one of Thy devoted servants. Amen.

Archbishop Gustavo's dispensation of all Catholics from the obligation to participate in the Mass on Sundays and other holy days of obligation within the territory of the Archdiocese of San Antonio granted on March 13, 2020 remains in effect until repealed.

At-risk people and those who have symptoms of the common cold, flu, or Covid-19 are asked to stay home.

Mass Participation

- Masks will be required for all persons, except children 10 years old and younger.
- No missalettes, song books, or prayer aids will be available.
- There will be no singing; only instrumental music during the Mass.
- There will be no exchange of peace by handshake or hug.

Mass Attendance and Seating

- Attendance will be limited to 25% of our normal capacity.
- Weekend Masses: Saturday 5 p.m.; Sunday 8 & 10 a.m., 12 p.m., 3 p.m. (Spanish) & 6 p.m.
- Mass will be held in the main sanctuary with overflow livestreamed in Msgr. Hubertus Hall.
 Sacramental Communion offered in both locations.
- Hospitality team members will seat you and you will need to sit at least six (6) feet apart.
 Family members may sit together without separation.
- Hospitality team members will also escort you from the church immediately after each Mass to allow time to sanitize the church prior to the next Mass.
- Follow the directions of our hospitality team members.
- Daily Mass will follow same guidelines for attendance, masks and social distancing.

Communion

- Remove gloves BEFORE receiving Holy Communion.**
- The Sacred Body of Christ will be distributed in the hand only, not on the tongue.
- Before reception of Holy Communion, lower your mask, allow the Eucharistic minister to place the Body of Christ in your hand, consume it, re-mask, and return to your seat.
- The Precious Blood of Christ will not be distributed.

Other Information and Guidelines

- The church will not open more than 20 minutes before Mass.
- All Masses will continue to be streamed online.
- A hospitality team member will bring the offertory basket to you. Drop your donation in.
- Only the main doors of the church will be open. Hospitality team members will escort you from there into church and from the sanctuary to the exit.
