
Together we strive to grow closer to Jesus Christ through the Holy Eucharist.

# GOSPEL MEDITATION: MT 13:24-43

Grace and sin, belief and unbelief, good and evil all exist together. While we wrestle with these two dimensions of reality inwardly, they are also witnessed in the actions and words of others. Many, all too often, beat themselves up because of their sin. We are also all too quick to pass judgment on others whom we perceive to be in error and walking down a wrong path. God does not make rash judgments, nor should we. Patience is the order of the day as is an understanding that God is ultimately the caller of the shots.

Our faith tells us that while God allows the wheat and the weeds to coexist, the wheat will always triumph. As long as we can cultivate even a little faith and a small measure of desire for God, He can produce abundant blessings and good things. Even when the weeds seem to have triumphed, there still may be a small measure of faith remaining that can be cultivated and grown. It doesn't take much! Unless a person




totally allows the weeds to reign, there is always to be found at least a small measure of faith, good, light, and love. With even this small portion, God can produce abundant growth.

Admittedly, it is easy to give into the weeds, and they grow very quickly. Any gardener knows this to be true. Sometimes, the weeds even seem more attractive and vibrant. Dealing with weeds can quickly become a losing battle, and they can look healthier and grow faster than the very plants we are trying to protect. It's easy to give into them and let them win. While God will deal with all things in due time, we are responsible for keeping things in check in the short term. It is our task to keep our eyes fixed on God's presence and mercy. We are asked to avoid judgment. And, it is not our responsibility to deal with the weeds in someone else's garden, only our own. One garden is enough responsibility for anyone.

Weeds have power. We have to realize this. While they can appear attractive and healthy, they can quickly choke us off from God's presence. Our task is one of maintenance and cultivating a desire for God. Even the smallest kernel of faith can grow into something wonderful. In God's time, the eternal harvest will come, and we will no longer have to worry about the weeds. ©LPi

# NATURAL FAMILY PLANNING AWARENESS WEEK: JULY 19-25

God designed marriage as an "intimate partnership of life and love" (see *Gaudium et spes*, no. 48). In God's design, marriage is a unique union of one man with one woman "for the whole of life" (see Canon 1055, *The Code of Canon Law*). Marriage is oriented to the good of the spouses and to the creation and nurture of new human life (see *Gaudium et spes*, no. 48). Making decisions therefore, about when and how many children to have in marriage is a sacred responsibility that God has entrusted to husband and wife. This is the foundation of what the Church calls, "Responsible Parenthood"--the call to discern God's will for your marriage while respecting His design for life and love.

The Catholic Church supports the methods of Natural Family Planning (NFP) because they respect God's design for married love. In fact, NFP represents the only authentic approach to family planning available to husbands and wives because these methods can be used to both attempt or avoid pregnancy. When learning about NFP, it is important to know that:

Natural Family Planning is an umbrella term for certain methods used to achieve and avoid pregnancies. These methods are based on observation of the naturally occurring signs and symptoms of the fertile and infertile phases of a woman's menstrual cycle. Couples using NFP to avoid pregnancy abstain from intercourse and genital contact during the fertile phase of the woman's cycle. No drugs, devices, or surgical procedures are used to avoid pregnancy.

NFP reflects the dignity of the human person within the context of marriage and family life, promotes openness to life, and recognizes the value of the child. By respecting the love-giving and life-giving natures of marriage, NFP can enrich the bond between husband and wife. (Standards for Diocesan Natural Family Planning Ministry, p. 23)

The dates of Natural Family Planning Awareness Week highlight the anniversary of the papal encyclical *Humanae Vitae* (July 25) which articulates Catholic beliefs about human sexuality, conjugal love and responsible parenthood. The dates also mark the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne (July 26), the parents of the Blessed Mother. # What is Natural Family Planning?

Natural Family Planning (NFP) is the general title for the scientific, natural and moral methods of family planning that can help married couples either **achieve or postpone pregnancies**.

NFP methods are based on the observation of the naturally occurring signs and symptoms of the fertile and infertile phases of a woman's **menstrual cycle**. No drugs, devices, or surgical procedures are used to avoid pregnancy.

Since the methods of NFP respect the **love-giving** (unitive) and **life-giving** (procreative) nature of the conjugal act, they support God's design for married love!

God our Father, empower married couples to live the beautiful call to free, total, faithful, fruitful love in the vow they exchanged in holy matrimony. Help them live faithful, exclusive love amid the challenges and temptations of the world. Strengthen them with the grace of their sacrament of matrimony to remember that you who gave yourself freely to your bride on the Cross show us the path to true freedom and a joy that endures forever. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Blessed Paul VI, pray for us! Amen.

# THE ENDURING CALL TO LOVE

#### Prophetic Witnesses Against Racism—Part 4

At times in its history, the Catholic Church in the United States has failed to denounce the evils of slavery, racism, and discrimination. But we have also been blessed with the courageous witness of many clerics, religious women and men and laypersons, who did respond prophetically by calling out sin and violent disregard for fellow human beings. Their lives remind everyone that we are all united in God's love and the life of Christ. Read about these four Catholics who worked to heal the evil of racism in their day. As you learn about their stories, reflect on how you can join this work of healing injustice in your community today.

#### César Chávez

César Chávez organized the first successful union of farmworkers in U.S. history. He was not only one of the great labor leaders of this century, he was also a heroic example of Catholic moral leadership. He was born in 1927 to a Mexican-American family who was forced to become migrant farmers during the Great Depression. As a child, he had to labor in the fields to support his family and was not able to advance past the seventh grade. As a young man with a wife and growing family, he was inspired by a priest with a passion for social justice to train as a community organizer. He gathered the Mexican Americans in Delano, California, formed the United Farm Workers, and led a strike against local table grape growers. The struggle for fair contracts was long and drawn out. When the workers were threatened and attacked, Chávez rejected any violent retaliation and turned



to non-violent actions. Going on a hunger strike, he fasted on a water-only diet for 25 days, which effectively drew national attention to the blatantly unjust wages and working and living conditions of the Hispanic migrant laborers in California. He was a devout Catholic who did not simply believe the teachings of Jesus Christ; he was transformed by them. They guided his efforts to secure just treatment for migrant workers.

#### **Mass Participation**

- Masks will be required for all persons, except children 10 years old and younger.
- No missalettes, song books, or prayer aids will be available.
- There will be no singing; only instrumental music during the Mass.
- There will be no exchange of peace by handshake or hug.

#### Mass Attendance and Seating

- Attendance will be limited to **50%** of our normal capacity.
- Weekend Masses: Saturday 5 p.m.; Sunday 8 & 10 a.m., 12 p.m., 3 p.m. (Spanish) & 6 p.m.
- Mass will be held in the main sanctuary with overflow livestreamed in Msgr. Hubertus Hall.
   Sacramental Communion offered in both locations.
- Hospitality team members will seat you and you will need to sit at least six (6) feet apart. Family members may sit together without separation.
- Hospitality team members will also escort you from the church immediately after each Mass to allow time to sanitize the church prior to the next Mass.
- Follow the directions of our hospitality team members.
- Daily Mass will follow same guidelines for attendance, masks and social distancing.

#### Communion

- Remove gloves BEFORE receiving Holy Communion.
- The Sacred Body of Christ will be distributed in the hand only, not on the tongue.
- Before reception of Holy Communion, lower your mask, allow the Eucharistic minister to place the Body of Christ in your hand, consume it, re-mask, and return to your seat.
- The Precious Blood of Christ will not be distributed.

#### Other Information and Guidelines

- The church will not open more than 20 minutes before Mass.
- All Masses will continue to be streamed online.
- A hospitality team member will bring the offertory basket to you. Drop your donation in.
- Only the main doors of the church will be open. Hospitality team members will escort you from there into church and from the sanctuary to the exit.

- Confession is offered only Wednesday and Thursday evenings, 5-7 p.m.




