
Together we strive to grow closer to Jesus Christ through the Holy Eucharist.

GOSPEL MEDITATION: JN 3:14-21

Is there something to Lent that goes beyond our own spiritual house cleaning and spiritual refinement? Yes, there is! It has to do with listening and learning so that we can take up the task of the Gospel with greater clarity and fortitude. While the spiritual refocusing of Lent is necessary, the fruit of this Lenten conversion has much more to do with learning how we can be a better Church than it does about our eternal salvation. Salvation is a gift that flows out of God's unconditional Mercy and cannot be merited. The spiritual maturity we can experience as a result of our Lenten disciplines serves to reduce the anxiety and apprehension we may experience as messengers of good, but very challenging, and unsettling, news.

St. Oscar Romero said that, "a church that doesn't provoke any crises, a gospel that doesn't unsettle, a word of God that doesn't get under anyone's skin, a word of God that doesn't touch the real sin



of the society in which it is being proclaimed, what gospel is that?" When we listen to those descriptive and provocative words, do they resonate with anything in our experience? As messengers of the Gospel, we are called to bring an unsettling message to the world. If our main concern is protecting our self-interests, then we are missing something huge! Many really struggle with being rejected, dismissed, or perceived as someone who is speaking out of turn. There is a counter cultural message that must be preached that clearly sides with the poor, marginalized, victimized, oppressed, neglected, disregarded, and lost souls throughout the world. There is a widespread misery among the peoples that is all too often allowed to fester with no one coming forward to offer a change or resolution.



The Church can speak to the needed structural changes that will allow people to earn just wages, feed their families and share abundantly and equally in the gifts of God's good earth. Such a vision is not some optimistic fairy tale, but the vision of the Creator himself. Lent reminds us, as St. Oscar Romero also states, that, "we are workers, not master builder, ministers, not messiahs. We are prophets of a future not our own." We are not called to labor simply for the benefit of the here and now but of the "what is to come." Our myopic vision can be replaced by a more far reaching Lenten vision that is much greater and deeper in scope. As long as we are carrying the right blueprints with us and our thoughts extend beyond ourselves, then even the little things we do and the simplest prayer we utter go a long way. They give witness to our preference for the light of Christ and not the darkness of error and sin. ©LPi



AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF ARCHBISHOP GUSTAVO GARCÍA-SILLER

Texas Governor Greg Abbott has announced that effective March 10, 2021, he would lift the mandate to wear masks in public. He also announced that all businesses could operate at 100 percent of capacity.

San Antonio Archbishop Gustavo García-Siller, MSpS, has determined, after reviewing the governor's order, and after seeking advice from health authorities and local civic officials, that all of the safety measures in place at the current time are to be continued throughout the Archdiocese of San Antonio until further notice. This regards the use of face coverings or masks; social distancing; hand washing; and regular use of sanitizing procedures that have been effective in keeping us safe. These will not be changed at this time.

Regarding COVID vaccinations:

"While Pfizer and Moderna vaccines should be chosen over Johnson and Johnson's where possible, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops said in a statement March 2 that it is "morally acceptable" to receive vaccines when "ethically irreproachable" options are not available. "Given the world-wide suffering that this pandemic is causing, we affirm again that being vaccinated can be an act of charity that serves the common good," the statement said. The statement was an update to one released in December that echoed the Vatican's statement, saying that Pfizer and Moderna vaccines were morally acceptable despite their "remote connection to morally compromised cell lines" due to the gravity of the pandemic."

El gobernador de Texas, Greg Abbott, anunció que a partir del 10 de marzo de 2021 levantaría el mandato de usar cubrebocas en público. También anunció que todas las empresas podrían operar al 100 por ciento de su capacidad.

El Arzobispo de San Antonio, Gustavo García Siller, MSpS, ha determinado, después de revisar la orden del gobernador y de buscar el consejo de las autoridades de salud y los funcionarios cívicos locales, que todas las medidas de seguridad vigentes en el momento actual continuarán en toda la Arquidiócesis de San Antonio hasta nuevo aviso. Esto se refiere al uso de mascarillas o cubrebocas; distanciamiento físico; lavarse las manos, y el uso regular de procedimientos de desinfección que han sido efectivos para mantenernos a salvo. Estos no se cambiarán en este momento.

Sobre las vacunas COVID:

Si bien las vacunas Pfizer y Moderna deben elegirse sobre la de Johnson y Johnson siempre que sea posible, la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de EE.UU. dijo en un comunicado el 2 de marzo que es "moralmente aceptable" recibir vacunas cuando las opciones "éticamente irreprochables" no están disponibles. "Dado el sufrimiento mundial que está causando esta pandemia, reafirmamos que vacunarse puede ser un acto de caridad que sirve al bien común", dijo el comunicado. La declaración fue una actualización de otra publicada en diciembre que se hizo eco de la declaración del Vaticano, diciendo que debido a la gravedad de la pandemia las vacunas Pfizer y Moderna son moralmente aceptables a pesar de su "conexión remota con líneas celulares moralmente comprometidas".

MASS ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES*

Archbishop Gustavo's dispensation of Catholics from the obligation to participate in Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses within the Archdiocese of San Antonio granted on March 13, 2020 is in effect until repealed. At-risk people or those with symptoms of the common cold, flu or Covid-19 should stay home.

Mass Participation, attendance & seating

- Masks will be required for all persons over age 10.
- Attendance will be limited to 50% of our normal capacity.
- Mass will be held in the main sanctuary.
- Sit at least 6 ft. from others. Families may sit together.
- Leave immediately after Mass.

Communion

- The Sacred Body of Christ will be distributed in the hand only.
- After the Eucharistic minister has placed the Sacred Body of Christ in your hand, lower your mask, consume the Body of Christ, re-mask and return to your seat.
- The Precious Blood of Christ will not be distributed.




