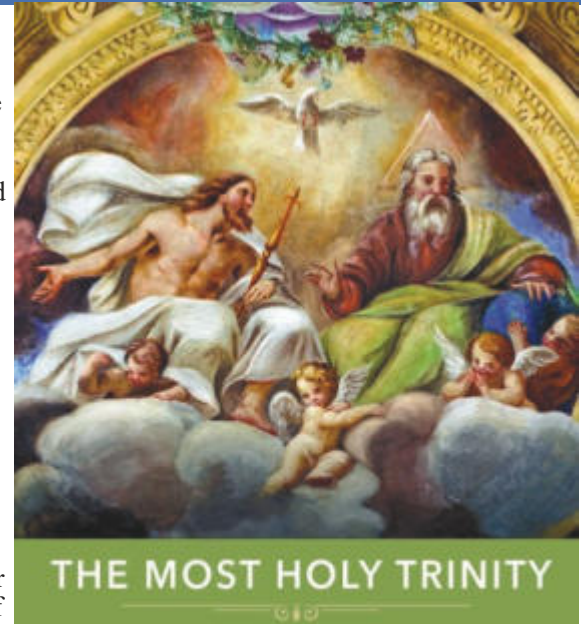

**GOSPEL MEDITATION:
MT 28:16-20**

Let God be who God is. This is often one of the hardest things to do. Rather than allowing the mystery of being created in the image and likeness of God unfold and take root in our lives, we change the dynamic. We want to be the creators who want to make God into the image and likeness we need God to be. We have a hard-enough time letting the people in our lives be who they are. We struggle even more so with God. It is almost as if we want God to be our imaginary friend who is not only with us whenever we need but becomes the Being we need God to be. Who is it that we want God to be today? A protector, disciplinarian, champion for justice, healer, advocate for our cause, grantor of prayers, guardian of my life, or the avenger? Our prayers tell an interesting story. When you pray, what does God look like?

Recently, a young woman who was feeling invisible, overlooked, ignored, and misunderstood by her husband struggled to make her feelings known and get his attention. Finally, she screamed, "Listen to me!" Thus, birth was given to a renewed and healthier relationship. We spend so much time storming heaven with our agenda and trying to make God into a "god" of our desires that we do not hear God saying, "Listen to me!" God is desperately trying to get our attention. God is saying, I am here among you as not one but three, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Many people seldom notice God's presence because they are so caught up with other spiritual cares and concerns. And, when the "god" they fashion and

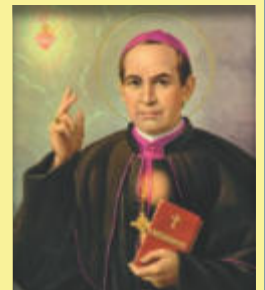

create doesn't produce as they desire, they shake the dust from their feet and move on. "I tried," they exclaim, "but God didn't listen."

Healthy relationships aren't built on making someone be who we need them to be. Healthy relationships are built on encounters of persons and the development of an appreciation of someone solely for who they are. Deeper relationships can even be found with two people marveling at each other and almost experiencing a childlike joy and giddiness when they see the other coming. Do you ever have these feelings about God? Believe it or not, God does for you! There is a joyful laughter that gives rise to and connects all three members of the Holy Trinity. It is this laughter, flowing from the very depths of the Godhead that not only keeps the Trinity in joyful unity but spills over into the creation of all beings and things. It is an expression of Divine Delight! Have you ever taken time away from your agenda to experience the Divine Joyfulness of God?

We can reach a connection of Presence wherein even the smallest of creatures suddenly radiate the fullness of God: the wonderful creation of their being, the innocence and playfulness of their movements, and the sustaining life breath that flows through their veins. The same God who created the heavens and the earth is the same God who wants you to call him 'Dad' and the same God who preserves your life and has all things in His care. ©LPi

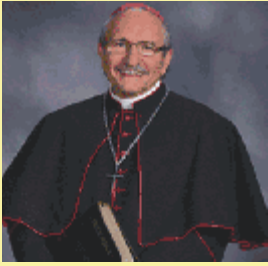

CHANGES TO COVID-19 GUIDELINES FOR CELEBRATION OF SACRED LITURGIES

From Auxiliary Bishop Michael Boulette's May 20 Letter

In regards to the Mass and other Liturgical celebrations, the following guidelines are presented:

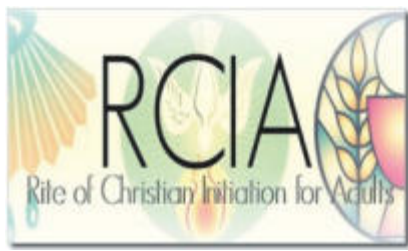
1. The use of masks and face coverings is not required for those who are fully vaccinated. We highly encourage those who are not vaccinated to wear masks or face coverings. We will not require proof of vaccination. We also highly encourage all to be vaccinated. There are ample opportunities for this.
2. Those who are ill, are asked to stay home until they are past all symptoms for 24 hours. Pastors have the authority to grant dispensations from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass on an individual basis for those who need such consideration.
3. Social distancing is encouraged if possible. However, it is not required at this time.
4. All locations should continue to consider how to appropriately sanitize their facilities as needed.
5. Hand sanitizers should continue to be available at appropriate locations.
6. Printed materials and hymn books may return for use.
7. Collection baskets may be passed during Liturgies to members of the congregation.
8. The offertory procession of bread and wine may resume.
9. All ordinary and extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist are encouraged to wear masks during the distribution of Holy Communion. They are also to sanitize their hands before and after the Communion Rite.
10. Holy Communion on the tongue is once again permitted.
11. Altar servers are encouraged to return at Masses.
12. Music ministries may return to normal as prior to the pandemic, as it is a prominent element of all Liturgies.

Con respect a la misa y otras celebraciones litúrgicas, se presentan las siguientes pautas:

1. No se requiere el uso de cubrebocas o cubiertas faciales para quienes están completamente vacunados. Recomendamos encarecidamente a las personas que no están vacunadas que usen cubrebocas o cubiertas faciales. No requeriremos prueba de vacunación. También animamos a todos a que se vacunen. Hay amplias oportunidades para hacerlo.
2. A los enfermos se les pide que se queden en casa hasta que hayan superado todos los síntomas durante 24 horas. Los párrocos tienen la autoridad de otorgar dispensas de la obligación de asistir a la misa dominical de manera individual para aquellos que necesitan tal consideración.
3. Se exhorta al distanciamiento físico si es posible. Sin embargo, no se requiere en este momento.
4. Todos los sitios deben seguir considerando cómo desinfectar adecuadamente sus instalaciones según sea necesario.
5. Los desinfectantes de manos deben permanecer disponibles en los lugares apropiados.
6. Los materiales impresos y los libros de himnos pueden volver a utilizarse.
7. Las canastas para colecta se pueden circular entre los congregados durante las celebraciones litúrgicas.
8. Se podrá reanudar la procesión del ofertorio de pan y vino.
9. Se anima a todos los ministros ordinarios y extraordinarios de la Eucaristía a usar cubrebocas durante la distribución de la Sagrada Comunión. También deben desinfectar sus manos antes y después del Rito de Comunión.
10. Se permite una vez más la distribución de la Sagrada Comunión en la lengua.
11. Se exhorta a los monaguillos a regresar en las misas.
12. Los ministerios de música pueden volver a la normalidad como antes de la pandemia, ya que es un elemento destacado de todas las liturgias.

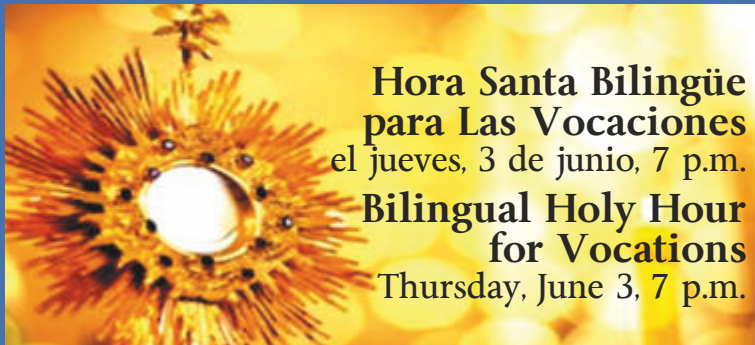
