GOSPEL MEDITATION:

JN 18:33b-37

We often come to life expecting all of the pieces of the puzzle to nicely fit together. We want and expect harmony, order, and fairness, the achievement of rewards for good behavior, good health, and happiness. We can more easily accept death when it comes naturally after a good long life, but have a real difficulty comprehending the meaning of it all when it is cut short. Willing to put in a good measure of effort, we desire positive results. When things go wrong and life gets hurtful, unjust, and downright ugly, we become unsettled and can quickly fall into despair. This is especially true if we are people of faith who believe in a God who sees things on our terms and works in favor of our life agenda. What happens to our faith when we find ourselves sitting in a mess?

Does it help to know that God understands and that hardship, failure, disappointment, injustice, confusion, and all of life's ugliness do not make faith irrelevant or irrational? God is wonderfully and surprisingly creative! He turns the tables on not only our understanding of life, but of what it means to be a king. God sends us a king who is not exempt from life's ills but embraces them. The king that God gives to us knows what it means to be poor, suffer insults, be ridiculed, face rejection, endure suffering, be betrayed, and face a most unjust and horrific death. This is our king. Jesus is not a king of prestige or grandeur but a king who brings light to darkness, hope to despair, sinners to mercy, and new life out of death. Christ dances before us pleading with us to hold on, cling to love, avoid being negative, stop feeling cheated, and be strong in

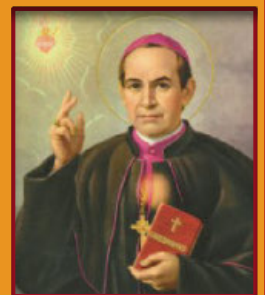

Failing to see this universal Divine Presence in all is one of the greatest mistakes we can make, for we also fail to see God, our king, as well. There are many things that can bring hardship to life. If we keep our head about us and do not lose hope, we can persevere and strive for the greatest degree of justice possible. Even though there are ample things that can challenge our faith, we also know that our deepest joy comes from union with God and our brothers and sisters. RELIGIOUS FREEDOM & THE DIGNITY OF THE HUMAN PERSON

Word of Life

The right to religious freedom has its foundation in the very dignity of the human person. ...It is in accordance with their dignity as persons—that is, beings endowed with reason and free will and therefore privileged to bear personal responsibility—that all men should be at once impelled by nature and also bound by a moral obligation to seek the truth, especially religious truth. They are also bound to adhere to the truth, once it is known, and to order their whole lives in accord with the demands of truth. However, men cannot discharge these obligations in a manner in keeping with their own nature unless they enjoy immunity from external coercion as well as psychological freedom. Therefore the right to religious freedom has its foundation not in the subjective disposition of the person, but in his very nature. In consequence, the right to this immunity continues to exist even in those who do not live up to their obligation of seeking the truth and adhering to it and the exercise of this right is not to be impeded, provided that just public order be observed.

Palabra De Vida

“El derecho a la libertad religiosa está realmente fundado en la dignidad misma de la persona humana”. ...Todos los hombres, conforme a su dignidad, por ser personas, es decir, dotados de razón y de voluntad libre, y enriquecidos por tanto con una responsabilidad personal, están impulsados por su misma naturaleza y están obligados además moralmente a buscar la verdad, sobre todo la que se refiere a la religión. Están obligados, asimismo, a aceptar la verdad conocida y a disponer toda su vida según sus exigencias. Pero los hombres no pueden satisfacer esta obligación de forma adecuada a su propia naturaleza, si no gozan de libertad psicológica al mismo tiempo que de inmunidad de coacción externa. Por consiguiente, el derecho a la libertad religiosa no se funda en la disposición subjetiva de la persona, sino en su misma naturaleza. Por lo cual, el derecho a esta inmunidad permanece también en aquellos que no cumplen la obligación de buscar la verdad y de adherirse a ella, y su ejercicio, con tal de que se guarde el justo orden público, no puede ser impedido.

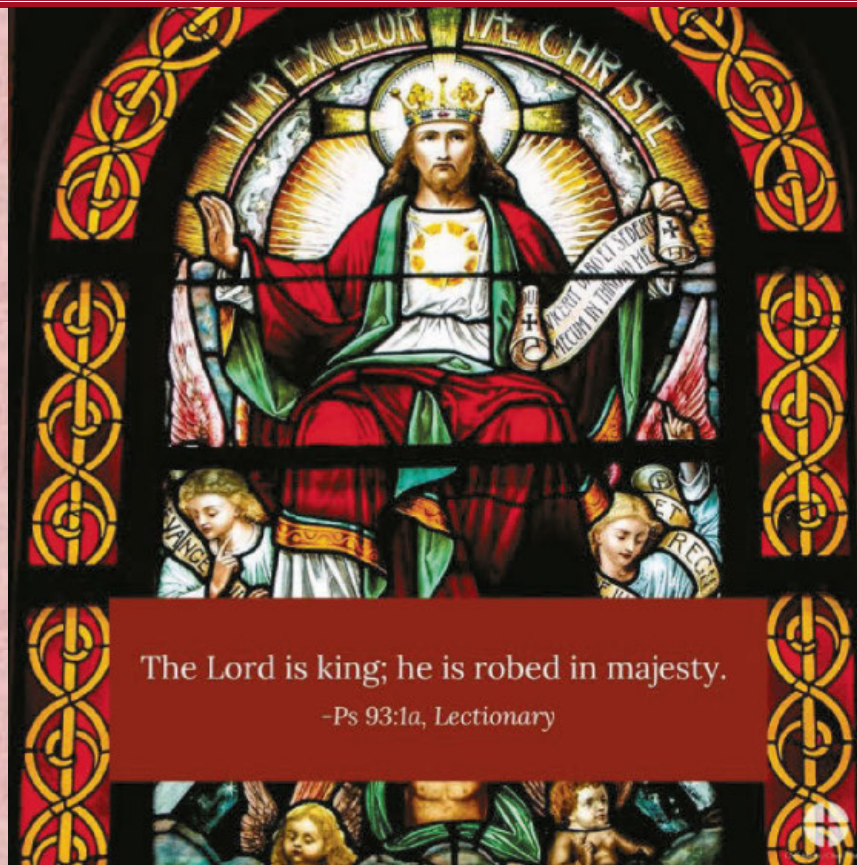

Reflection: Jesus's heart moved him to heal the sick, comfort the grieving, and raise the dead. Love moved him to work wonders. This same love also moves us to care for those in need, but in recent years, the Church and her members have faced increasing obstacles to doing so. Many, such as the Little Sisters of the Poor, have had their right to religious freedom suppressed.

As Catholics, we must stand up for religious freedom in our own country and around the world, drawing strength and resilience from the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

THE SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE



On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King.

Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical *Quas primas* (“In the first”) to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to “thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law” out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

During the early twentieth century, in Mexico, Russia, and some parts of Europe, militantly secularistic regimes threatened not just the Catholic Church and its faithful but civilization itself. Pope Pius XI’s encyclical gave Catholics hope and—while governments around them crumbled—the assurance that Christ the King shall reign forever. Jesus Christ “is very truth, and it is from him that truth must be obediently received by all mankind” (*Quas primas*, 7).

For Christians, when our faith is repeatedly marginalized in public life, we can fall into the habit of compartmentalizing our lives. We love Jesus in our private lives, but we shrink from acknowledging the kingship of Christ in social life. When we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we declare to the world and remind ourselves that Jesus is the Lord of the Church and of the entire universe.

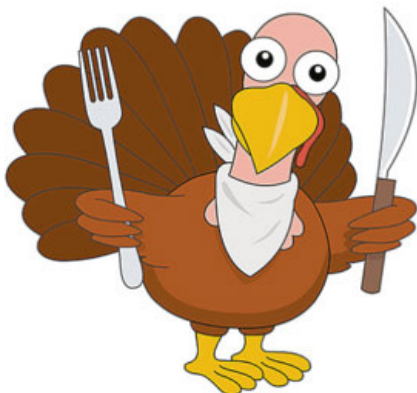

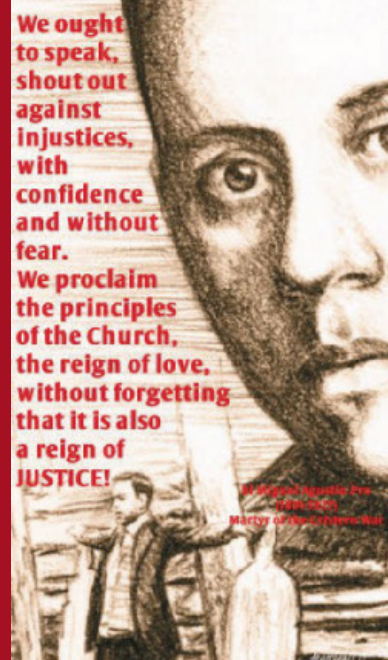

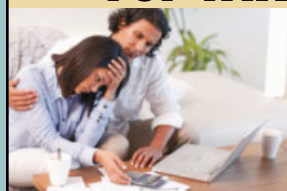
