GOSPEL MEDITATION: MT 13:44-52

Our culture seems more polarized and divided than ever. Into this wounded situation, our Catholic faith has a healing remedy to offer: the gift of wisdom. When the Lord offers to give King Solomon anything the monarch desires, he requests "an understanding heart" (1 Kings 3:9). In his polarized situation, the King doesn't ask for power to defeat his enemies. He asks for a wise and understanding heart to judge right from wrong. This wisdom is elevated and fulfilled in Jesus who teaches us to bring forth "both the new and the old" (Matthew 13:52).


In our fractured society, we Christians should stop pining for political power to crush our perceived

enemies. That often just makes things worse. Rather, it's much more useful to beg for the grace of true wisdom which transcends both sides of the aisle. This places us in a fresh position from which we can help our culture see what is true and good all across the ideological spectrum. Sometimes we'll look like liberals (e.g., in our love for the poor and marginalized) and other times like conservatives (e.g., in our sexual ethics and views on religious freedom). Because this wisdom is free from ideological narrowness, it will help to heal these painful fractures. Lord Jesus, this week, pour into us your healing wisdom.

Reflect:

In Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade and returned the issue of abortion to the

people's elected representatives at both the state and federal level. Despite this monumental legal victory, abortion policy is far from settled.

Sadly, over the past year, several states have used this opportunity to not only keep abortion legal, but also to pursue even more extreme pro-abortion policies. Currently, abortion is legal in more states than not. Our dedicated efforts are desperately needed in the months and years to come to protect preborn children and their mothers from the tragedy of abortion.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that we are *"the salt of the earth"* and *"the light of the world"* (Mt. 5:13-14). As Catholics, we have a duty to pursue the common good and to work for the protection of the most vulnerable. Our faith, formed by the teachings of the Church, should guide our engagement in civic life.

Each of us is called to live out our faith publicly, witnessing to the Gospel. For, "*if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot*" (Mt. 5:15-16). We cannot hide our faith under the "*bushel basket*." Rather, our "*light must shine before others*" (Mt. 5:15-16).

Inspired by the Gospel, we must do what we can to end violence in the womb, to ensure that preborn children are fully protected by our laws, and to support mothers and fathers in welcoming and nurturing their children. May we all faithfully embrace our shared Christian responsibility and be strengthened by God's grace when we encounter resistance or persecution. Together, may we help build a culture of life and civilization of love in our nation.

- Read and meditate on <u>Matthew 5:1-16</u>. Pray for the grace and courage to bring your faith into the public square, working for the protection of all human life.
 - Choose one day over this next week to fast from entertainment. Refrain from television, movies, social media, and non-spiritual reading.
 - Offer some other sacrifice or prayer that you feel called to do for this month's intention.
